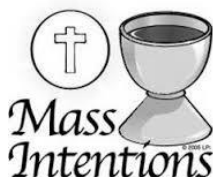

### STATEMENT OF WEEKEND OF MAY 28-29, 2016 BY FR. DAN

As some of you already know this past week Fr. Kamil was called to the office of Bishop Serratelli and told that he was being transferred to Holy Rosary Parish in Passaic, a Polish parish, effective June 29. Obviously this came as a shock to both him and myself.

Bishop felt the needs for a parochial vicar were greater at Holy Rosary than at St. Matthew's. He will not be replaced by another priest. Obviously Fr. Kamil is very sad, upset and distraught by such sudden news; as I am sure all of you are, I am deeply saddened, upset and disappointed. Fr. Kamil has been a wonderful addition to our parish community and has been a wonderful support to me, a good friend and has energized all of us in our call to service at St. Matthew's especially his work with our young people who are so very important to us.

Fr. Kamil and I are working diligently in responding to this situation and ask your prayers for all involved in this process. Ultimately, the final decision is up to our bishop. We Catholics, especially priests, pledge obedience to our bishops as successors of the apostles, for the sake of the unity and needs of the larger church. But there are times when that obedience is hard. This is one of those times, for Fr. Kamil, for me and for all of us. Let us pray for one another at this difficult time.

I know as always we as a community will pull together and allow the Holy Spirit to lead us. I hope and pray people will come forth to serve in new ways to continue the fine work established by Fr. Kamil.

Please keep him in your prayers and thoughts. I find much solace in the words of the prayer of St. Ignatius Loyola: "give me your love and your grace. This is sufficient for me."

**LOW GLUTEN EUCHARIST:** As a reminder, for those parishioners or visitors who have Celiac Disease or have an allergy to gluten in food products, we offer gluten-free hosts for Eucharist. ***If you desire to receive this host, we ask that you notify the Deacon at least 5 minutes before Mass in order that we can prepare for the special host for the Mass.***

## WALKING THE TALK OF LAUDATO SI

Home...it goes beyond the four walls of your house, the borders of your yard, or your town. "Our common home" as described by Pope Francis in his Encyclical, *Laudato Si*, is the world. Just because there are four walls, doesn't mean our home ends "there." What we do inside those walls, affects our "home" and our brothers and sisters within our common home whether they are human, plant or animal.

Inspired by his "call to action" of *Laudato Si*, St Matthews will begin to "walk the talk" of taking care of our earthly home. A great way to start is with Water.

Water is life...we can go without food for about 3 weeks (not that that would be fun.) Without water...3 days without water and we'd perish. Do we really ever give it much thought?

We are the fortunate; turn on the faucet and clean water spills out. Now with the summer weather here, we enjoy pools, sprinklers, cool water to drink, the list goes on. Water, it's always been and seems like it's in endless supply.

In *Laudato Si*, our Pope Francis eloquently addresses our responsibility of caring for our common home and for our making changes if we wish to leave resources for our children, grandchildren and generations to come. He speaks of water: "*access to safe drinkable water is a basic and universal human right, since it is essential to human survival and, as such, is a condition for the exercise of other human rights.*"

However, things have really changed; something once regarded as a basic human right has become "commodified." (To learn more, BOTTLED LIFE and TAPPED are available on Netflix or YouTube.)

With all this, and more in mind, we at St. Matthews have taken the first step with water as it relates to parish events.

A water filter has been installed in the small sink in the kitchen, with capability of filtering about 5,000 gallons per filter. It has a hose attachment for ease of filling pitchers and coolers for meetings, parties and the like.

An issue that goes well beyond the recycling of the plastic water bottles; water commodification is over-pumping our groundwater worldwide, leaving water tables lower and lower. Easy to think that this is happening in India or on the other side of the globe...What about Flint?? Or Fryeburg ME or Atlanta GA?

We can stand with Pope Francis and help expand the spirit of *Laudato Si*...let's all try to reduce, if not totally stop, buying cases of water for use in our homes. We can no longer do what "we've always done;" to make a difference. A journey begins with one step.
