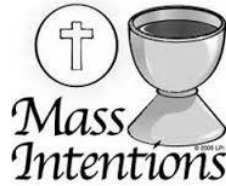

MARRIAGE: Arrangements are usually made one year in advance. Please contact the Parish Office for an appointment.

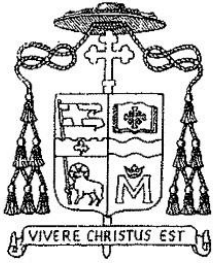

This month, parishes are asked to take up a combined collection for three worthy causes: the Catholic Communications Campaign, Catholic University and the Black and Indian Missions.


