Finally, Tom said, "I don't have any money to give you" to which the man responded again, "Have you anything for my file." Tom searched his pocket for a piece of paper to give this delusional soul and found a brochure which he gave him but the man said, "I don't have a file for that in my box. My name is Henry. What's your name." "Tom." He wouldn't offer anything else because he just didn't want to get involved. As he walked away Tom noticed Henry was writing something on the paper he gave him.

A few days later as he passed the same area he noticed police and EMT's were trying to help someone but their efforts were hopeless. With no name the police were asking everyone around if they knew the person. Tom responded, "All I know is his name is Henry." The policeman said, "Well at least we'll have a name for his tombstone. By the way, take this box of his and do with it as you will because that will save me a lot of paperwork." Tom took it looking for the nearest trash can but before he dumped it, he opened it. There was not much in there except some old clothes and a file folder with a crude title on it that read, *Friends*. Inside the folder was a single scrap of paper. On it was written Tom.

As Tom discovered, sometimes God can be found in a simple moment of acknowledging another person's basic dignity and presence. In the Gospel this weekend Jesus' call to fishermen to be his "fishers" is a call to all of us to help one another discover the love of God.

## HAPPY NEW YEAR ALL!!

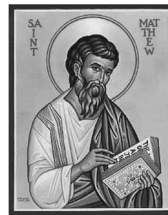

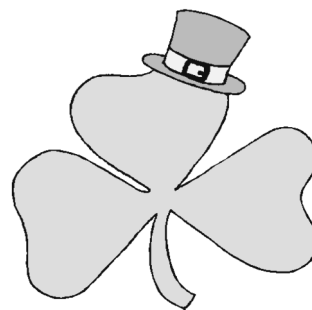
