The many gifts that we receive in abundance, he said, "are the gracious gifts of the Most High God, who, while dealing with us in anger for our sins, hath nevertheless remembered mercy." We can disagree with Lincoln that God deals with us in anger for our sins, but who can disagree with his acknowledgement of God's mercy?
