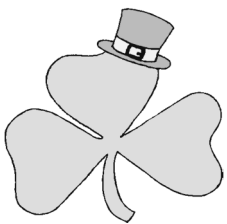

FAST AND ABSTINENCE GUIDELINES

Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics 14 years and older on all Fridays during Lent. Fasting is to be observed on Good Friday by all Catholics who are 18 years of age but not yet 59. Those who are bound by this may fast on one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid food between meals is not permitted.
